Pupil Premium- what difference is it making?

Communication and Language remains a high priority with equipment that is accessible to the children purchased, building on the particular interests of children of EM.

The inside and outside learning environments have been a focus this half term. Well-defined areas of learning that allow accessibility for all children inside the classroom have been enhanced and adapted in the Summer Term following staff observation of their use by children in receipt of PP. Achieved through a mixture of moving existing resources and the purchase of natural open ended shelving and soft sensory cushions and throws, well-organized resources have created both active and quiet spaces, the latter of which targets a child in receipt of PP in particular who has been identified as not on track in regards to their self-regulation and for whom a quiet space is required throughout the day.

The ethos of accessible hand on learning resources being available to children has been developed in the outside environment over the Summer Term. Achieved again through a mixture of reusing existing resources and the purchasing of additional resources that allow children to make choices in their play within clearly defined resourced area's. For example, resources promoting physical skills are now available in one area, clearly signed encouraging children to have free access but also encouraging children to respect their nursery environment by understanding where resources 'belong' when they have accessed them. The defining of a mathematics area in particular has benefited a child in receipt of PP who was previously reluctant to access the outside environment.

In the collaboration between the rising 2's and the rising 3's/4's in enhancing the outside environment, children will be introduced to environments that mimic each other in terms of resources with the aim to support children's emotional well-being during transition times due to the familiarity of resources. The resources purchased aim to promote awe and wonder, promoting opportunities for children to explore freely but also aiming to promote communication and language in children's expression in what they see/experience.

Communication and Language has been targeted in the rising 2's through the purchase of small world resources that encourage story telling and exploration.

In purchasing resources, the nursery looks to purchase quality resources that would be of benefit to future cohorts. For example pupil premium children have benefited from resources purchased in 2023 in respect of their listening and attention with 'Lola' and the Time to Listen resources.

All children are baselined in September and upon entry (spring/ summer starters) to highlight areas of development with staff looking to see if a child is on track or not on track, supported by moderation of children’s records. We look at a child’s actual age and compare this to their developmental age.

The school constantly has a “can do” approach to teaching and learning and this is found in our I CAN progress sheets. With parents we discuss other developmental areas / skills that need to be worked on over the next few weeks, to diminish the difference, and support children to make accelerated progress according to their actual age compared to their academic age.
